Students will be able to complete a Registered Nurse A.A.S. degree based out of KPC. KRC and KBC alternate starting coursework each Spring with a cohort of 12 and 8 students respectively. The coursework is done via distance delivery (on the internet) as well as weekly sessions via interactive video with instructors in Anchorage. A majority of the clinical experiences will be done in Soldotna or in Homer, but some will be held in Anchorage due to limited local opportunities.

NOTE: Talk to an advisor about the program if you are interested. Competition for the available seats is vigorous and there is a well-defined ranking system. Applications must be in the Anch. Nursing Dept.'s office on July 1st before the next cohort starts in January. It takes most students 1-2 full years to acquire the "credentials" for a complete application with a real chance of being accepted.
